 - Examine linkages with schools, and the community
 - Provide a basis for involvement of all present and future members of PANZ


- It is important to capture and preserve the history of steelpan evolution in Australia/NZ

Geographic Spread Of Community/ Professional Steelbands





Geographic Spread Of Steelbands In Schools





Opportunities and Challenges

Opportunities

- In early stages of development and can build on what exists to create hubs in key areas of Australia and NZ
- Greater information sharing can lead to further synergies and networking
- Use critical mass and success of 1st Australian Steelband Festival for grant applications, awareness of pan in Australia and NZ
- Good linkages with some academies and schools already but could be more aligned with objectives of PANZ
- Several committed people to develop pan and are aware of mistakes/shortcomings of other organizations to avoid same mistakes
- Potential to reduce imports in areas of local manufacture
 - Pans, accessories, etc.
 - Virtual marketplace possible?
- Several pan professionals have expressed willingness to visit/share their knowledge and expertise
- Grants for a common umbrella organisation, versus individual bands applying for competing funds. Funding can still be accessed by bands. Corporate sponsorship can also be approached
- Some bands are strong on pushing the Trinidad roots (Flags, history, uniforms, culture, etc.)
- Improve information access (website). Link to key pan websites (When Steel Talks, Pan Jumbie, etc.)

Opportunities and Challenges (Cont'd)

Challenges

- Australia being such a vast country makes logistics and travelling expensive and things will take time
 - Lack of local makers of pan cases, stands, aluminium sticks and everyone is fending for themselves
 - Funding for events which will involve several bands
 - Difficulties in holding meetings
- Repertoires not always scored and music is lost when people leave
 - Can use scores to circulate music (Some use Sibelius, Musescore, Finale, Logic Pro). Can use links to drumbeats
- Refine Events schedule and planning as this is key unifying factor
- Knowing skills available (database required)
- Getting schools and music teachers interested. Building the next generation
- Making and Tuning availability and capability low for existing base/growth
 - Explore use of workshops in Australia and NZ
- Logistical issues / Standardisation of instruments
- Sourcing players as band members leave (how to build)
- Funding from government/state has reduced with more focus on indigenous support
- Wide and varying sentiments expressed about PANZ in terms of getting common areas of benefit
- Public Liability for event
- Different State & National Government legislation

Objectives of PANZ

- The following are the Objects of Association formed when PANZ was incorporated in QLD in August 2013
 - provide a focal point of contact for steelbands and steelpan players
 - promote and foster steelbands
 - plan steelband development activities such as workshops which may include visiting overseas pan players
 - plan and produce regular steelband festivals, and other regional events
 - work with educational authorities to promote and develop steelbands in schools
 - forge links and work with other Caribbean Associations
 - seek and secure funding to assist with the association's activities.

- provide a focal point of contact for steelbands and steelpan players
 - Database with contact information to be developed of all members, tuners, arrangers, manufacturers, soloists, bands, etc.
 - Provide a network and website showing news/events for all the bands, workshops, etc.
 - Central point for funding applications for events involving multiple bands
 - sharing of resources, e.g. music, tips, e.g. how-to-manage-a-community-band.

- promote and foster steelbands
 - PANZ can provide the network for promoting and supporting new steelbands as well as the existing network
 - E.g. making/borrowing drums for bands to get started.
 - Bands/events are promoted on PANZ website

- plan steelband development activities such as workshops
 - These can be regional such as joint workshops held with bands in an area (e.g. South East Queensland)
 - Or they may include visiting overseas or local pan players, arrangers, etc.

- plan and produce regular steelband festivals, and other regional events
 - Build on success and learning the highly successful 4st
 Australian Steelband Festivals
 - in April 2013 in Marysville (<u>You Tube</u>)
 - 2nd-Festival held in Sep 2015 in Brisbane (You Tube)
- Hold every 2 years
- Rotate across different venues until it can grow in a selected location

- work with educational authorities to promote and develop steelbands in schools
 - Build on linkages with existing academies
 - Identify bands which have linkages with schools for sourcing players
 - Identify people willing to score arrangements
 - One can utilise services also of people such as Yuko Asada (NIU) and Kareem Brown (Trinidad)
 - but aim to develop local expertise
 - Identify pan players willing to work with schools

- forge links and work with other Caribbean Associations
 - Establish linkages only for information of activities with
 - Caribbean Association of Victoria, CARIBVIC
 - Website
 - Caribbean Australian Association, CAA (WA)
 - Carib Oz, Sydney
 - Website
 - Rivercity has linkages with West Indian community in SEQ (informal)
 - run by the Bajan community (>150 families) in Queensland

- seek and secure funding to assist with the association's activities.
 - Establish potential grants and deadlines for application
 - Get expertise to follow up on this area
 - Link with budgets for PANZ events

Best Practices/Strengths to share

- Transporting instruments
 - Trailers, racks (Alvin, Denis, Matthew, Linda)
- Pan stands (bass stand : 3 on top Perth Pandemix)
- Music score programs (free to use Musescore, Rita)
- One can become a member of a music agency, such as Music Victoria, Music NSW, the Music Council of Australia MCA and can get more luggage allowance for group bookings or individual artists for trips with Virgin Australia. (<u>Website</u>)
- How to handle and maintain instruments (Alvin). E.g.
 sprays, surface repair with muriatic acid +re-spraying
 (Rita), spray paint with compressor (Violet), chroming after
 rusting (car shops Violet)
- Collapsible stands

Strategies to implement Short and Long term

Short Term

- Formation PANZ and Website completed, update Strategic Plan
- Define grant availability and timelines in various states
- Establish database with contact information of committee and members
- Continue to learning common tune as a super steelband
- Get information from University of Trinidad and Tobago (UTT) on tuning programmes.
 Explore potential MOU with PANZ (done)
- Organisation of next Steelband Festival in 2017

Long Term

- Self sufficiency in instruments and accessories
- Have local expertise in tuning (apprenticeships, workshops, etc.)
- Train the trainer (music teachers, etc.) for new bands in schools or communities
- Have a regular Australian/NZ festival. Make an established event on a global scale (but be careful to build successfully with good quality). Local festivals can still be held
- Have established programmes with pans in schools
- PANZ participation in World Panorama. Build linkages with sister bands in TT, Europe, UK, etc.
- Introduce pan in disadvantaged communities (e.g. City Angels in TT by the Music Literacy Trust) <u>City Angels</u>
- Establish relationship over time with UTT

Measures for Performance

- Festivals/Workshops held at regular intervals
- 5 year strategic plan actions developed and being executed
- Maintaining or growing bands and players
- Financially healthy without losses. Funding obtained through grants, sponsors. Annual financial audits performed with good transparency. Self supporting or partially self-supporting - through sale of merchandise, event ticket sales and membership fees.
- Survey to PANZ members completed at periodic interval to get a pulse on needs and achievements

APPENDIX 2

Expectations Bands Have Of PANZ

· Bringing credibility to steelband movement

- "I hope that PANZ will help to provide a certain level of 'respectability' trespectability' to steelpans / steelbands and in this way, add weight to any proposal to develop the pan movement as a whole"
- "PANZ can help to give recognition to the Australian/New Zealand steelpan movement and by providing a central point of contact will be easier to connect with other steelband associations"
- "Create awareness of steelpan to those who have never experienced something like this before"
- "help in promoting the instrument"
- "Putting Australia/New Zealand on the map as far as pan playing goes"

Festivals/Events/Workshops

- "By organising regular festivals/events and arranging for accomplished pan artists/players/composers to visit and offer workshops and professional development opportunities. By coordinating such things so that the benefit of accessing such artists is shared by more players, thus improving the standard of playing generally."
- "Lift the level of proficiency. Provide greater audience. Contribute to feelings of pride. Access to mentors and specialists. Lift profile of the band"
- "Perhaps organize music weekends or music camps for children (and their parents) during school holidays.
 Assist with providing easy music materials and access to youth panorama.
- "Benefit from any common workshops/festivals"
- "Being able to participate in international events which require synergies/organization across all bands in Australia"
- "Having high profile festivals/events (ref. 1st Australian Steelband Festival)"
- "keep us informed of pan players that are in touring Australia and/or holding workshops, help connect with other steelband if and when they may want to travel to play in other places around Australia"

Expectations Bands Have Of PANZ (Cont'd)

Access of Funding

- "PANZ should be a more effective vehicle for accessing funding for pan development than individuals or small bands."
- "Funding opportunities "
- "Help in acquiring funding, would be a top mark"
- "Being part of an umbrella organization (which may help local funding access). Grants that PANZ can access, rather than each band having to request funds from the same source"

Networking/Information Sharing/Promotion

- "PANZ can act as a 'one-stop' shop for anyone with an interest in engaging a steelband, finding a tuner or seeking an opportunity to learn or join a steelband or start their own band."
- "Networking and advertising in the community"
- "Having a calendar on the PANZ website with all gigs listed of every PANZ band, so that when pan people travel they could go to other steelbands' gigs. "
- "Incorporate news from all school steelbands into a newsletter written for children, and invite kids to contribute stories to the PANZ youth steelband newsletter."
- "PANZ will provide a central contact point for Steelbands in the region and therefore will be easier for anyone wishing to join a steelband to find us. It will also be easier for visiting and overseas musicians to make contact. Sharing of information will be easier especially if we have a member blog on the website. Funding opportunities may arise from the association which will help bands to take part in major events such as steelband Festivals and workshops with visiting musicians."
- "Introduce band to other steelbands in Australia/NZ, learn and share our knowledge, share arrangements, provide cheaper cost effective alternatives. Promote our band"
- "consultation with players of Trinidad and Tobago, regular information on the world of Pan"
- "Being part of a database where we can share/access resources"
- "putting pan people in touch with each other, sharing information on pan related things like instruments, music scores, tuners, etc."

Expectations Bands Have Of PANZ (Cont'd)

Outlet for young players

 "Provide access to steelbands around the country for these young players when they leave school so they keep playing music"

- "Provide support if any players decide to form their own bands in the future"
- "Working with schools/students who then go on to form their own steelbands, or score music, or stage their own events."

Music Material for bands

- "Provide workshop material for beginners, conduct workshops for beginners on specific Trinidadian style music, help us find easy calypso music (scores and mp3 files) that matches our level. Combined workshops, dissemination of shared material (score sheets, mp3 files)."
- "It would be nice if we had a list of songs that all PANZ bands can play, similar to the "Netty Netty" experience of the Community Super steelband at the 1st Australian steelband Festival in Marysville. This way, when some of the PANZ steelbands meet each other somewhere, or all come together at the next festival, we can play a number of songs together as a big steelband again. "
- "Provide children tutorial materials and music scores for simple calypsos. Provide workshop sessions for the older kids teaching calypsos and/or provide Trinidad and Tobago music/cultural sessions like Banana Joe for all age groups, including very young children"

Reduce costs/business opportunities

- "Buy stuff in bulk to get discount prizes e.g. rubber tips for the sticks and disseminate to bands (against payment of course)."
- "Lower costs if there can be strategic sourcing of materials"
- "Create business opportunities for pan players, makers of accessories, etc."
